Year Five and Six Winter Netball 2023

The Primary Competition for Year Five and Year Six students is played during terms two and three. Boys are welcome to play.

Venue:

Netball North Harbour, 44 Northcote Road.

Time:

Wednesday evenings, between **4:00pm and 7:00pm**. Game times are 4.00pm, 4.50pm, 5.40pm and 6.30pm. You will only play one game per week and the game time may change from week to week.

The 2023 Winter League will run from **Wednesday 3 May to Wednesday 23 August** (14 weeks).

Fees and Registration:

The cost per player is **\$105**. To register your child and pay the fees, please go online to https://www.campbellsbay.school.nz/online-payment-portal/ and select "2023 Year 5 **OR** 2023 Year 6 Winter Netball" under "Campbells Bay School Sports". The online registration process needs to be completed by **Tuesday 21 March**. Please make sure that you register in time, as late registrations cannot always be accepted.

Trials:

Both year five and year six students will trial during school hours on **Wednesday 22 March** and **Friday 24 March**. The trials will go ahead whether wet or fine.

Trial One Wednesday 22 March: An experienced selector from Netball North Harbour will run these trials.

Trial Two Friday 24 March: Keri Maunder and Taryn Ramsay will run this trial.

Team selections:

These are based on performance at the trials and the number of registrations received. There may also be consultation with your child's coach from last year when it comes to final team selections.

The students will be briefed on the day on how the trials are run and how the final team selections are made. Every effort is made to ensure we make the trial process as transparent and fair as possible. Please respect the trial/selection process and accept the decisions regarding team selections. Thank you for your understanding.

IMPORTANT:

Please ensure your child is wearing appropriate footwear (no sandals/ jandals) for the trials. Children who do not have appropriate footwear will not be allowed to trial.

Coaches and Managers:

The successful running of sports teams at CBS relies on the help of parents to coach and manage the teams. Each team will need a parent volunteer to coach the team. The coach will run a weekly training and organise the team at games on a Wednesday. A parent volunteer is needed to help manage the team. The manager liaises with the team regarding the draw and any other information that needs to be passed on. Each netball team will also need to supply an umpire. If you would like to volunteer for any of these roles, please do so during the online registration process. Assistance can be given to help you get started in these roles. Please note that you must have successfully completed the school's police vetting process to be a coach or manager.

Uniform:

The school sports shorts or skirt and school sports t-shirt must be worn with sensible sports shoes.

- Never argue with referees, coaches, and officials. Without them, we would not have a game.
- > Be a good sport and applaud good play whether by my team or the opposition.
- > Thank the opponents, referees, and the coach at the end of the game.
- Treat all players, as I would like to be treated.
- Wear the correct sports uniform.
- Use appropriate and acceptable language.
- > Win with humility, lose with dignity.

Parents/ Spectators/Supporters Code of Behaviour

I will ...

- > Ensure my child wears the correct sports uniform.
- > Remember children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not mine.
- > Applaud the performance of both teams.
- Encourage my child to play within the rules and respect the officials, referees and coaches decisions.
- Lead by example and be positive with the officials, coaches and referees.
- Let the players play their game, not mine. Leave the directions of play to the coach.
- Praise efforts not results. Teach my child honest effort is as important as victory.
- Remember children learn best by example. Comments from the side line need to be unbiased and positive.
- Accept umpire/referee's decisions whether I agree with them or not.
- Recognise and respect the value and importance of volunteer coaches and managers who give up their time and resources for the sporting benefit of my child.
- Not ridicule or yell at my child or any other player for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Make sure I know the process to follow should I have any concerns regarding incidences or behaviour during a game. I will NOT approach any players or opposition teams directly myself.
- ➤ I will notify the school in writing, before I register my child for a team sport, if we are going to be away for more than three weeks during the semester/ league/ competition.
