# **TOUCH RUGBY 2023**

Touch rugby is a fast, fun, non-contact game for both girls and boys and is open to all year levels from year one to year six. The school offers two options for registering your child to play touch rugby. In both cases players must be registered through the school via Kindo.

Registration and payment need to be completed by **Wednesday 6 September** via the school online payment portal. *Please note that due to the very large number of teams and students playing touch rugby each year, late registrations <u>cannot</u> always be accepted.* 

## Competition:

This is a "Local Touch Junior Module" which is affiliated to Touch North Harbour and Touch New Zealand. Go to <a href="https://www.localtouch.co.nz">www.localtouch.co.nz</a> for more information.

## **Dates and Times:**

Thursday 19 October to Thursday 14 December

Games are 30 minutes each and are played every Thursday after school. Your team will play one game per week. The start time of games will be either 3:45pm, 4:15pm, 4:45pm, 5:15pm, 5:45pm or 6:15pm. The year one and twos tend to play the earlier games and the year five and six's the later times, but this may not always be the case.

#### Venue:

The venue will be confirmed once the council allocates all bookings. The venue for term four will be Becroft Park <u>OR</u> Sunnynook Park.

### **Uniform:**

CBS navy sports shorts and CBS sports shirt. <u>No bare feet allowed</u>. Trainers and rugby, soccer and touch boots are all fine if the boots have moulded sprigs (**no metal**).

### Teams:

Please read **ALL** the information carefully and note that if you opt for option two, that team make up is totally dependent on the number of players registered under this option. Teams may end up being mixed teams and children may not always be with friends.

# **OPTION ONE**

To submit a team of your choosing, including a parent manager, a coach, and a team name to the school. Please note that your team MUST have a parent manager and coach when it is submitted.

To register your child, please go online to <a href="https://www.campbellsbay.school.nz/online-payment-portal/">https://www.campbellsbay.school.nz/online-payment-portal/</a> and select "Touch Rugby 2023" under "Campbells Bay School Sports". Please select the corresponding year group for your child. During the registration process select **option one**. Please indicate the team's name during the registration process. To assist in this process, if you are the designated team manager, please email Keri Maunder (<a href="mailto:kerim@campbellsbay.school.nz">kerim@campbellsbay.school.nz</a>) with the team's name, manager's name, coach's name, and **ALL** the player's names **before Wednesday 6**September. If this doesn't happen, you may not have all your players allocated to your team.

Please read the **important points** below:

- 1. The name of every team member <u>MUST</u> be on the team list emailed through by the team manager. If a name is not on the manager's list, the player is **NOT guaranteed** a spot in the final team. (Please try to limit team numbers to eight or nine players per team.)
- 2. In addition to the team list emailed through by the manager, each child in the team needs to individually register via the online payment portal by **Wednesday 6 September**. Late registrations may miss out on a spot in the team. The manager's list is not your child's registration

#### **OPTION TWO**

To register your child as an individual. Children will be arranged into a team by the school. A parent coach and manager will still be required for these teams. Please note that these teams can only go ahead if we have enough individually registered players and both a parent coach and a manager.

Please select the corresponding year group for your child. During the registration process select **option two**.

## **COMPETITION INFORMATION**

- Year One & Two mixed, boys, girls (If there are not enough year one and two girls' teams for a grade, they will be placed in a mixed grade)
- Year Three & Four mixed, boys or girls
- Year Five & Six mixed, boys or girls

#### Please note:

- \* Teams play on the field as a **6-a-side** team. A total team size would ideally comprise of eight or nine players.
- \* Mixed teams must have a minimum of four girls registered. (Three on the field at all times)
- \* The Year one & two competition plays on half a touch field.

### **Coaches and Managers:**

The successful running of sports teams at CBS relies on the help of parents to coach and manage the teams. If you can volunteer to coach/manage a team, please indicate this during the online registration process. Coaches and managers must hold a current CBS police vet. Teams with no manager or coach will be withdrawn from the competition.

### Fees:

**\$50.00** per child. Fees are to be paid online through the school online payment portal.

### I will ...

- > Play for enjoyment, not just to win or to please others.
- > Play hard but fair and by the rules.
- > Be committed to the team. Attend all practices where possible and be punctual and see the season through.
- Never argue with referees, coaches, and officials. Without them we wouldn't have a game.
- > Be a good sport and applaud good play whether by my team or the opposition.
- > Thank the opponents, referees, and the coach at the end of the game.
- > Treat all players as I would like to be treated.
- > Wear the correct sports uniform.
- Use appropriate and acceptable language.
- > Win with humility, lose with dignity.

# Parents/ Spectators/Supporters Code of Behaviour

# I will ...

- > Ensure my child wears the correct sports uniform.
- > Remember children are involved in sport for their enjoyment, not mine.
- Applaud the performance of both teams.
- > Encourage my child to play within the rules and respect the officials, referees, and coaches' decisions.
- ➤ Lead by example and be positive with the officials, coaches, and referees.
- Let the players play their game, not mine. Leave the directions of play to the coach.
- Praise efforts, not results. Teach my child honest effort is as important as victory.
- > Remember children learn best by example. Comments from the side-line need to be unbiased and positive.
- > Accept umpire/referees' decisions whether I agree with them or not.
- > Recognise and respect the value and importance of volunteer coaches and managers who give up their time and resources for the sporting benefit of my child.
- > Not ridicule or yell at my child or any other player for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Make sure I know the process to follow should I have any concerns regarding incidences or behaviour during a game. I will NOT approach any players or opposition teams directly myself.
- ➤ I will notify the school in writing, before I register my child for a team sport, if we are going to be away for more than three weeks during the semester/ league/ competition.
