Primary School Badminton Tournament 2021

Dear Parent/ Caregiver,

Your child has been selected for a school badminton team and will represent CBS at the annual North Harbour Primary Schools tournament during school hours.

Date: Thursday 27 May

Time: 9.15 am -2.30 pm

Please meet at school on the library steps at **8.40 am**.

Children will be back at school before 3.00 pm.

Venue: Harcourts Cooper & Co North Harbour Badminton Centre, Bond Crescent, Forrest Hill. Spectators welcome.

Transport: By car. Please indicate when registering online if you can help with transport. Please note that to be able to help with transport you do need to have successfully completed the schools' police vetting process.

Uniform: CBS navy sports shorts and CBS sports T-shirt. Non-marking sports shoes.

What to bring: Lots of healthy food for morning tea and lunch. NO LOLLIES PLEASE. Also bring a water bottle and a school jumper. Please no mufti jumpers. You can bring your own racket if you have one. You are welcome to use a school racket. Please indicate this during the online registration process.

Permission and payment: Please go online to <https://www.campbellsbay.school.nz/online-payment-portal/>. There is a fee of **\$8.00** to pay which contributes to the team entry fee. You will also be asked some questions which are compulsory to answer. These will give your child permission to attend. Some of the questions also relate to whether you can assist with transport on the day.

In order for your child to play in the team and for arrangements to be finalised, the registration and payment process must be completed by **Monday 24 May**.

Parent helpers: In order for each team to attend the tournament, each team MUST have a parent helper at the tournament with them. Please let us know if you are able to assist with this during the online registration process. Please note that if your child's team does not have a parent volunteer to help, the team will have to be withdrawn from the tournament. To help with managing a team, you do need to have successfully completed the schools' police vetting process.

Umpiring: The players will be expected to umpire during the day, so some knowledge of the rules is required. The scoring system is rally point. The player who wins the rally scores a point, regardless of who served. Your child has been given a copy of the simplified rules. Please make sure they have read these and understand them by next Thursday.

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Player Code of Behaviour

I will ...

- Play for enjoyment, not just to win or to please others.
- Play hard but fair and by the rules.
- Be committed to the team. Attend all practices where possible and be punctual and see the season through.
- Never argue with referees, coaches and officials. Without them we wouldn't have a game.
- Be a good sport and applaud good play whether by my team or the opposition.
- Thank the opponents, referees and the coach at the end of the game.
- Treat all players as I would like to be treated.
- Wear the correct sports uniform.
- Use appropriate and acceptable language.
- Win with humility, lose with dignity.

Parents/ Spectators/Supporters Code of Behaviour

I will ...

- Ensure my child wears the correct sports uniform.
- Remember children are involved in sport for their enjoyment, not mine.
- Applaud the performance of both teams.
- Encourage my child to play within the rules and respect the officials, referees and coaches decisions.
- Lead by example and be positive with the officials, coaches and referees.
- Let the players play their game, not mine. Leave the directions of play to the coach.
- Praise efforts not results. Teach my child honest effort is as important as victory.
- Remember children learn best by example. *Comments from the side-line need to be unbiased and positive.*
- Accept umpire/referees decisions whether I agree with them or not.
- Recognise and respect the value and importance of volunteer coaches and managers who give up their time and resources for the sporting benefit of my child.
- Not ridicule or yell at my child or any other player for making a mistake or losing a game.
- Make sure I know the process to follow should I have any concerns regarding incidences or behaviour during a game. I will NOT approach any players or opposition teams directly myself.
- I will notify the school in writing, before I register my child for a team sport, if we are going to be away for more than three weeks during the semester/ league/ competition.
